Jerry Foley, Susquehanna University

Susquehanna University is a division III school in central Pennsylvania that competes in the Landmark Conference. Coach Foley has also been an assistant at West Point and was the head coach of Bucknell University in the Patriot League. He also has extensive experience as a club and YMCA coach.

Mike Schnur, University of Pennsylvania

Coach Schnur has been the head coach at Penn for 14 years. He graduated from Penn in 1988 and has served as both a team captain and an assistant coach as well. This past summer, Penn grad Brendan McHugh finaled in both breastroke events at Olympic Trials.

Kirk Sanocki, Wingate University

Wingate University is a division II school in North Carolina that competes in the Bluegrass Mountain Conference. Coach Sanocki has been at Wingate for 11 years and was named the 2012 National Division II coach of the year for his teams fifth place finish at the NCAA Championships. He is also the current president of the College Swimming Coaches Association of America.

Bill Wadley, Ohio State University

Coach Wadley has been at Ohio State for 24 seasons and is one of the most respected coaches in the country. The 2010 Big Ten men's coach of the year has placed teams in the Top 25 for most of his tenure at OSU. He is a past president of the American Swimming Coaches Association and has been on the US National team staff a number of times.
