Special Note:

The YMCA Regulation Costume for Competitive Swimming Meets in 1924 & 1925.

Competitors in swimming events shall be required to wear a regulation costume, known as a YMCA racing suit, in accordance with the following regulations:

Material shall be of dark color only.

The suit shall extend *not less* than four inches below the crotch, and shall be cut in a straight line around the circumference of the leg. The armhole shall be cut no lower than four inches below the arm pits. A supporter of dark color must be worn underneath the suit. Contestants shall be required to come cloaked to the starting mark and re-cloak immediately after emerging from the water.
